UPAF Bright Minds delivers high-quality, much-needed arts education programming throughout Southeastern Wisconsin.

- Bright Minds programming reaches more than 100,000 students annually with the majority from underserved households.
- Since 2011, UPAF has distributed \$3,168,000 in support of arts education, serving nearly 200 different schools.
- Bright Minds evaluation research measures program impact on five skills identified as critical to workforce success: leadership, teamwork, problem solving, problem identification and resourcefulness.
 - » 47% of students experienced positive change across all five measured skills as a direct result of Bright Minds programming.
 - » Students who began with the lowest skill levels experienced the most growth. In other words, these programs are impacting children most in need of enriching and skill-building outreach.



UPAF Connect brings underserved audiences to UPAF Member Group productions while also taking the performing arts out into communities served by partner nonprofits. Partners participate in workshops, residencies and other activities tailored to their needs. UPAF Connect partners choose from over 50 workshops/classes and 35 staged productions each year.

- UPAF Connect benefits nonprofit partners and UPAF Member Groups: UPAF Connect is clearly valued by the community and activities have shown to increase engagement and interest in the arts by providing much-needed family-friendly arts events in local communities.
- 36% of UPAF Connect participants surveyed had never attended a live performance or arts event in the past.
- UPAF Connect also enhances the efforts of its nonprofit partners. The program surpassed its goal to increase collaboration, partnership, outreach and community access by 40%.
