### Increasing Access to Music, Dance, Song and Theater

Thanks to donors like you, community members with special needs, disability, illness or other challenges in accessing the arts are able to enjoy programming and performances tailored to their unique needs through Kasey's Fund, presented by MGIC.

### Inspired by a Love for the Arts

In 2020, Kasey's Fund was created to ensure that everyone can experience the magic of the arts by eliminating barriers imposed by disability, special needs, geography and other physical and mental considerations.

Kasey's Fund was inspired by former UPAF President & CEO Deanna Tillisch's middle daughter, Kasey. Kasey was born with a chromosome deletion, 1p36, which resulted in profound cognitive and physical disabilities. Because of the chromosome deletion, Kasey cannot walk, talk, read or write, but music is one of her great joys and one of the main ways she expresses herself.

Kasey's story reinforces why the arts matter. The ability to share in the performing arts opens up new worlds for everyone and can have especially great resonance for those who might be most likely to lack access — either due to disabilities or special needs, trauma or severe illness, or Alzheimer's or dementia.

- Milwaukee Ballet's Tour de Force program in partnership with Children's Wisconsin, using dance instruction to advance the health of children with physical disabilities
- Danceworks' Artist in Residence program with St. Ann Center for Intergenerational Care, engaging children and seniors through dance

full suit, and jacket and hat—completely just ecstatic to be in the theater and as they're walking out their
guardian comes up to me and grabs me by my hands and shakes them and says, 'thank you.' To see the
enthusiasm to be in the space and to have such a sincere thank you from a member of the community, it
really made it clear to me that these [performances] aren't just fun nights on the town, or just better versions
of the production that are more accessible. For many, these [performances] are incredibly special and
incredibly necessary for them to be able to engage in the art form."
