# **Bowing Rogue**

The 414 Quartet brings elegant phrasing, dynamic virtuosity and years of experience to any background or center stage event needing music from Bach to Broadway (flexible grouping, 2-4 players).

#### Kabat-Thomas Cello Duo

MSO cellists Madeleine Kabat and Peter Thomas first met more than a decade ago while attending school, but it wasn't until they reconnected years later in Milwaukee that love struck. The husband and wife cello duo is shaped by their individual paths and performance experiences. Kabat, a seasoned soloist and chamber musician, and Thomas, an MSO veteran and indie-rocker, team up to form the Kabat-Thomas Cello Duo as an extension of their passion for the instrument. Witness the synchronicity of MSO's cello couple in an intimate setting that celebrates great cello repertoire.

## **Little Lake Stompers**

A traditional jazz group, including Kirk Ferguson on trombone; Scott Tisdel, bass; retired MSO trumpeter Dennis Najoom; and William Helmers, clarinet. Other members include Paul Westfahl, drums; Glen Quarry, saxophone; and Lou Cucunato, piano (flexible grouping, 4-8 players).

## **MSO Brass Quintet**

The MSO Brass Quintet offers a wide variety of selections from Renaissance dances to Sousa marches and everything in between. MSO members Matthew Ernst, trumpet; Alan Campbell, trumpet; Darcy Hamlin, horn; Megumi Kanda, trombone; and John Thevenet, bass trombone share a wide variety of their favorite pieces in personal, interactive performance experiences suitable for an audience of all ages and backgrounds.

#### **MSO Horn Quartet**

Enjoy the music of the MSO horn quartet featuring the MSO horn section, including Matthew Annin, Dietrich Hemann, Darcy Hamlin, and Josh Phillips. This group is ideal for an attentive performance in a medium-to-large space.

## **MSO Trombone Trio**

The MSO Trombone Trio offers a wide variety of selections including Renaissance, fanfares, and popular music. The trio features the MSO trombone section, including Megumi Kanda, trombone; Kirk Ferguson, trombone; and John Thevenet, bass trombone (flexible grouping is available to add a tuba for a low brass quartet if desired).

## Pangaea

Audiences can enjoy one of the MSO's most beloved Arts in Community Education (ACE) ensembles, Pangaea, to learn how the MSO supports arts integration in schools. This Afro-Caribbean percussion and steel drum duo develops students' awareness and understanding of how music is built by emphasizing polyrhythms, a formal principle in this genre of music.

ZYP! is Milwaukee's versatile flute-violin-cello trio featuring MSO assistant principal flutist, Heather Yarmel; first violinist, Lijia Phang; and cellist, Adrien Zitoun. ZYP! Performs classical standards from Bach to Piazzolla and a variety of light/familiar classics.
